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Learning During COVID-19 Alert Level 2, 3 and 4

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1. STATEMENT OF POLICY

During the COVID-19 pandemic, continuation of education services in the Cook Islands is to be guided by the Cook Islands COVID-19 4 Level Alert System. The Alert system is led by Te Marae Ora (TMO) and is aligned with New Zealand's system where each Alert Level describes the different measures required. (Appendix A).

Alert level 3 and 4 indicate threat to the country from COVID-19. During Alert level 3 and 4, all educational facilities are closed.

Alert level 2 requires schools to apply preventative measures including physical distancing and hygiene measures as per the TMO national response framework.

The Ministry of Education (MoE) acknowledges that some parents/caregivers may not want their children to attend school during this time. This policy provides guidance for learning as an interim measure during Alert level 2 and gives guidance on what to expect during Alert Levels 3 and 4.

2. PURPOSE

The MoE is committed to meeting the following legislation and guidelines:

- i.) 'Learning for Life' Cook Islands Education Master Plan 2008-2023
 Learning and Teaching.
 Focus: Equitable access to quality learning and the experience of success through a range of programmes that meet individual needs and celebrate individual talents.
- ii.) 'Te Kaveinga Nui' National Sustainable Development Plan 2016-2020 Goal 8 Inclusive and equitable quality education and promote life-long learning opportunities.
- iii.) Ministry of Education and Te Marae Ora COVID-19, 4 Level Alert System.
- iv.) Cook Islands Curriculum Framework
- v.) Education Act, Cook Islands. 2012. Section 23. Compulsory Enrolment and Attendance
- vi.) Student Attendance, Transfer and Truancy Policy, EAP 03 003 MoE
- vii.) Public Health Act, Cook Islands. 2004.

3. SCOPE

This policy applies to all parties who are bound by the requirements of the Education Act (2012) including all private schools who are bound by a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with MoE and parents/caregivers of enrolled students.

4. STRATEGIC OBJECTIVES and OUTCOMES

- Ensure the health and wellbeing of learners during the COVID-19 pandemic
- Recognise parents/caregivers concerns for health and wellbeing of learners during the COVID-19 pandemic
- Provide guidance on expectations during Alert levels2, 3 and 4.
- Provide guidelines for learning at home during Alert level 2.
- Ensure home learning allows for learners to be delivered the full Cook Islands curriculum
- Ensure processes are in place to outline responsibilities of home learning during
 Alert level 2

5. POLICY DETAIL

5.1. COVID-19 Alert Levels and Education

5.1.1. Alert Level 1 - Prepare

 Schools are open and all students enrolled and attending as per Education Act, 2012, Section 23.

5.1.2. Alert Level 2 - Reduce

- Schools are open and all students enrolled and attending as per Education Act, 2012, Section 23.
- Self-isolation and/or quarantine may be required for all staff and students who
 have traveled internationally until negative test results received.
- Unwell staff and students are to remain at home, following TMO guidelines.
- Increased monitoring of student and staff absences.
- Contact tracing App active and in use across all education facilities.
- School visitors, walk-in's may be restricted. All visitors are requested to tag in and physical distance, where appropriate.

- Hygiene measures reinforced across all education facilities including regular wiping down of surfaces and items, and sanitizing.
- Restrictions on professional development opportunities, large scale national education events or school/ sporting events may be applied, upon advice from TMO.
- Continuation of NCEA examinations and assessments are guided by NZQA Alert level 2 requirements.
- Pastoral care processes active including 0800 3333 free hotline established for all school aged students and staff to access counselling support. Regular checkins with scholarship students, and impacted staff.
- COVID preparedness revisited for schools, providers and HQ.

5.1.2.a. Home learning when schools are designated as open:

During Alert Level 2, parents/caregivers may apply to the MoE to provide home learning to specific learners, in consultation with teachers and the school.

Parent/caregivers must apply in writing to the MoE's Planning & Development division prior to the commencement of home learning with information that includes:

- i. detailed reasons why home learning is being requested
- ii. evidence that the parent/caregiver has time, resources and initiative to facilitate appropriate home learning
- iii. support from the school of which the learner is enrolled, or evidence of collaboration
- iv. a date when the learner will return to school (no longer than one term, or maximum of 12 weeks).

Home learning will entail:

- Provision of learning by the parent/caregiver upon advice from the school.
- Parents will have the responsibility to ensure a full curriculum is delivered while
 the student is at home. As this opportunity is only an interim measure, it is done
 in good faith and the MoE, through the school, will be monitoring or checking on
 families.
- Resourcing will be the sole responsibility of the parent/caregiver.
- Enrolment will be maintained, however parents are to inform when the child is sick and not available for learning to inform school records
- Responsibilities of parent is to update school weekly on progress
- Interim home learning ceases on the date agreed open, as per 5.1.2.a (iv), whereby the learner is expected to return back to school on the next available day the school is open. Interim home learning will also cease when there is a change to Alert Levels 3 and 4.

Learning at home during Alert level 2 applications can be submitted during this
time by families to the Director of Planning & Development, but approval is
subject to meeting all application requirements as per Education Act 2012,
section 24.

5.1.3. Alert Level 3: Restrict

- Schools are closed. MoE and schools are responsible to ensure continuity of learning via isolated teaching model.
- Continuation of NCEA examinations and assessments are guided by NZQA Alert Level 3 requirements.

5.1.4. Alert Level 4: Lockdown

Schools are closed. MoE and schools are responsible to ensure continuity of learning via isolated teaching model.

NCEA examinations and assessments are suspended due to school closures and NQZA will inform of alternative date options for any region experiencing Alert level 4.

6. RISK and MITIGATION

The table below lists examples of possible consequences, along with mitigating actions, that relate to this policy not being adhered to:

Issue/Risk - examples	Mitigation - examples
Parents/caregiver unable to provide adequate educational opportunities for learners via home learning	Approval for Home learning during an Alert Level 2 will only be given under meeting the strict requirements of the application process. If a school deems a parent or caregiver is no longer able to provide adequate learning for the child and has sufficient evidence of this, the approval status under this policy will be revoked and the child must return to school the next school day after notification.
Poor health and wellbeing of learners	Student support services will be informed immediately of any concerns and the support framework activated in collaboration with relevant stakeholders like Ministry of Internal Affairs if needed. Student support can visit homes when necessary.
Increased workload for teachers and schools	Communication is key between all relevant stakeholders and planning ahead of time is a necessary factor. Teachers are encouraged to utilize the online resources recommended by the MoE

The Planning & Development Division will monitor and evaluate the implementation and impact of this policy and report as required. The policy will be reviewed 1 year from the date of implementation and biennially thereafter.
